Digital Libraries Initiative within i2010

- Launched in September 2005
- Aim: make Europe's cultural and scientific heritage accessible to all
- Deals with different types of cultural material: books, newspapers, films, archival holdings, ...
- Three areas of focus:
 - Digitisation
 - Online accessibility
 - Long-term preservation

- Political/institutional
- Technical: co-funding through FP6/FP7, *eContentplus*

Commission Co-funding

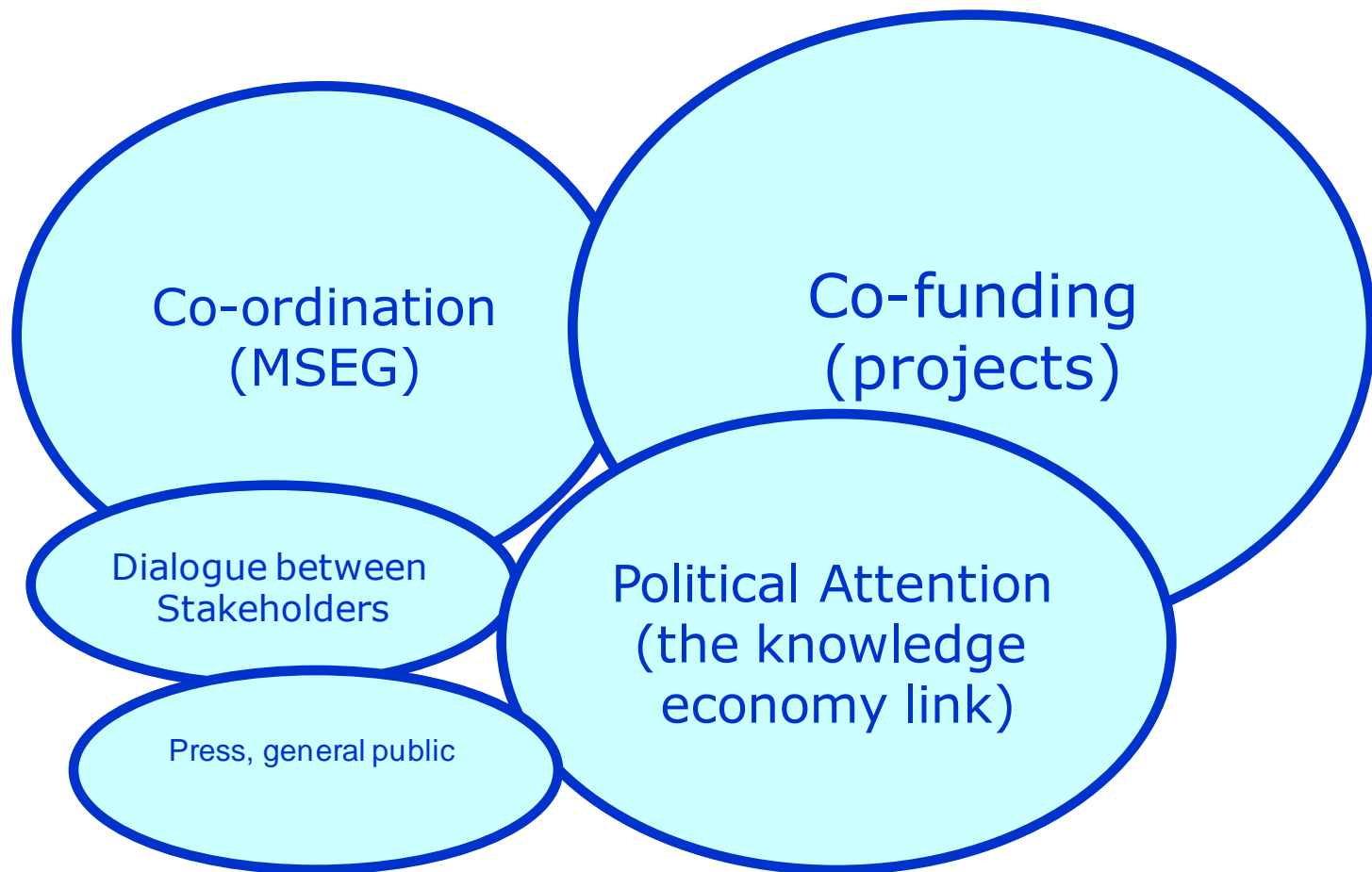
FP7: e.g. centres of competence for digitisation (IMPACT), technologies for digital preservation *eContentplus* (2005-2008), range of projects involving archives, libraries, museums, audiovisual archives

Continued support for digital libraries

FP7: 69 MEUR in 2009 and 2010

CIP: 50 MEUR in 2009 and 2010 (part of this for digitisation)

Europeana

- Continuing support from KB, Dutch government, other Member States, and the EC
- Functioning prototype
- Object model designed [but will be modified including elements from CIDOC CRM]
- Nearly 5 million objects
- Partner network of circa 200 institutions
- Governance and business models proposed
- Attracted 8 million euros of funding
- Begun to set up an organisation

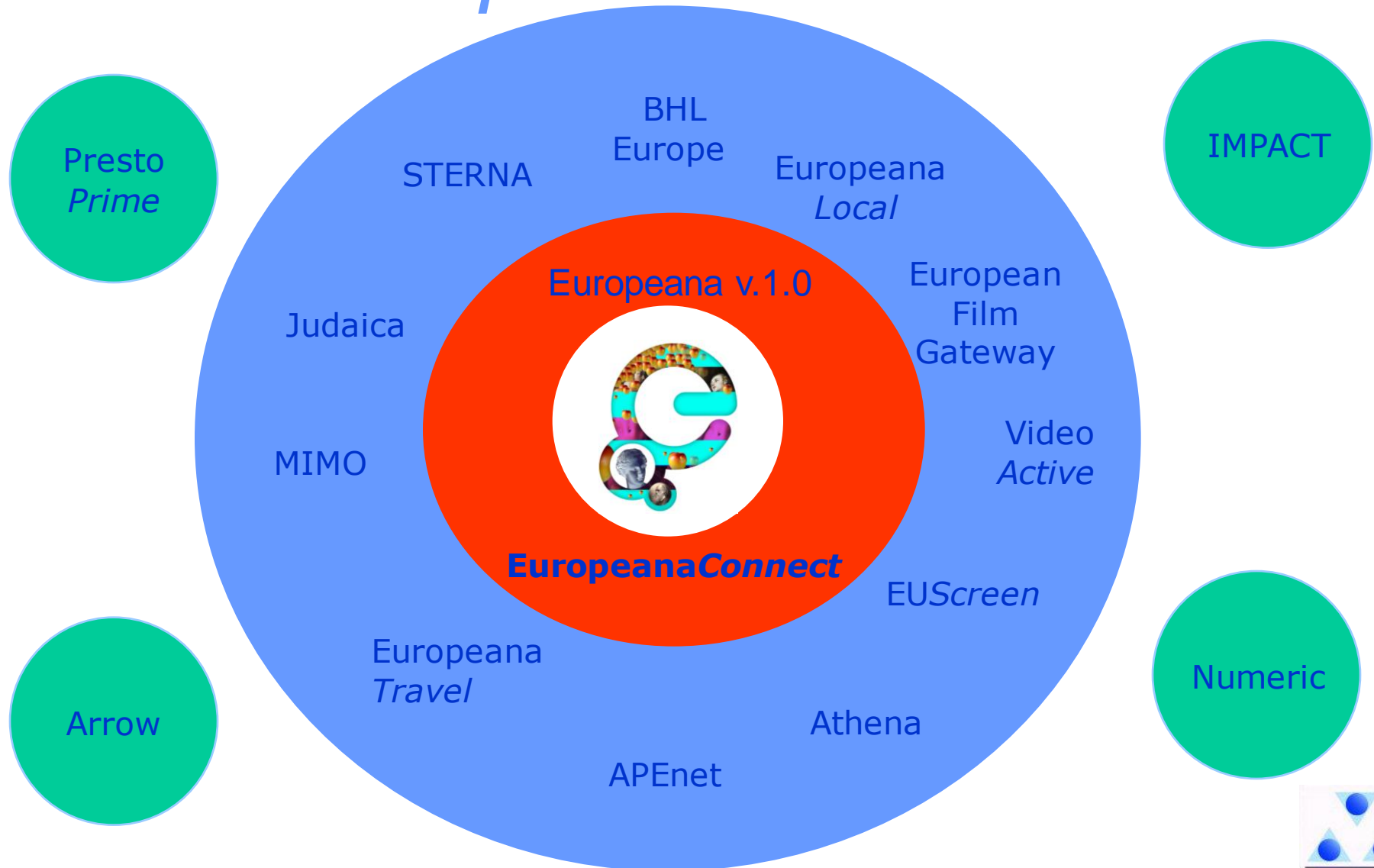
A vision for 2011
